This past year saw enhancements to the physical appearance of the community, numerous community-building activities and planning and advocacy efforts designed to preserve our unique character while improving one of Western Pennsylvania's best neighborhoods. Some accomplishments from the past year include:

- Through the work of MACC's Greening and Beautification Committee and numerous dedicated residents we've seen the addition of over eighty new street trees to the community, enhancements to the garden plots at the gateways to the neighborhood and community clean ups that yielded the collection of over one hundred bags of rubbish.
- Meanwhile, MACC's Community Development and Transportation Committee coordinated efforts to soften the impact of the Route 28 detour, assist in final engineering design for the Heth's Run Bridge and encourage community input into the Port Authority's new route plan and the City of Pittsburgh's Visioning Plan for the AlleghenyRiverfront.
- The neighborhoods business district continues to see investment as the result of a community organized concept vision. PWSA OFFERS LOW-COST WATER AND SEWER LINE INSURANCE

Many of you have replaced sewer lines yourself or know neighbors that have, so you may be aware of the unexpected hardship this expensive repair can create for homeowners. In January, PWSA began offering insurance at a minimal cost that will completely cover water and sewer line repairs. Unlike earlier insurance programs, you have to opt-out if you prefer not to be covered by this program.

You have probably already noticed an additional \$5 charge on your monthly PWSA bill for "Line Warranty - Water & Sewer". Those who choose to make this monthly payment will be completely insured in the event of a water or sewer lateral line failure or collapse. Many other water and sewer line insurance programs exist, but set a maximum coverage amount or only cover one of the two lines. With the PWSA line warranty, whether the repair costs \$1,000 or \$15,000, the entire bill will be covered by the insurance.

If you currently have line insurance from another party, be sure to research your options and cancel the lesser program to avoid a duplicate expense. If you choose to opt out of the PWSA program before June 2010, you will receive a refund of the money that you have already paid into the system. To opt out, submit the Opt-Out Election Form sent with your most recent bill, call 1-866-998-7965, or visit www.utilitylinesecurity.com. If you choose to retain the PWSA coverage, contact your current provider to learn about your cancellation options.

In my two years in office, I have heard from many constituents who did not have sewer line insurance and could not afford the high cost of line repairs when they discovered a break. Whether your water and sewer line insurance is offered through PWSA or another carrier, programs like these protect customers from financial crisis, reduce unsanitary conditions in our neighborhoods caused by broken sewer lines, and ensure repairs to our city's infrastructure are made quickly.

Exciting developments are underway in Morningside! Popular seasonal activities, new businesses, new residents, the development of the Morningside Elementary School and so much more! MACC wants to more effectively communicate to each other as well as to the broader Pittsburgh community about Morningside and its many assets.

MACC has engaged communications partners, Diane Wuycheck along with Patricia Murphy, to work with us to build a communications strategy and a mechanism for implementing it. This initiative is being funded by a grant from the City's Urban Redevelopment Authority. Diane has 30+ years of marketing and communications experience. Pat is a community development professional, the author of the book "Organizing for Community Controlled Development: Renewing Civil Society" and a professor in the University of Pittsburgh's Department of Social Work.

MACC encourages the involvement and input of all! The communications strategy will be built by you and for you through a series of interactive methods with multiple opportunities for the community to come together, provide insights and ideas about communications. We will work toward consensus on how we communicate about Morningside.

The process starts this month! Plan to attend a community meeting whether or not you are a MACC member. If you live or do business in the neighborhood you are invited! Bring your family and friends. These will be facilitated discussions with a set of goals to cover, for example, Morningside's strengths and weaknesses regarding communications; Morningside issues you want to hear more about; communications means you prefer (newsletter, email, phone, social media), etc. Dates and times were selected to accommodate various work and family schedules.
