**Important Traffic Notice
Route 28 Detour To Begin Soon**

PennDOT will begin construction on Route 28 beginning June 8th and continue into late October. The construction project includes portions of Route 28 North. PennDOT is establishing a detour that will direct all northbound traffic across the 62 Street (R.D. Fleming Bridge) onto Butler Street to the Highland Park Bridge.

MACC, with the assistance of The Pittsburgh Zoo and Aquarium, PennDOT, the office of Councilman Patrick Dowd and the City of Pittsburgh's Engineering Department, is working with residents to smooth the impacts of this detour as much as possible. PennDOT and the City will be implementing the recommendations provided by residents at the May MACC meeting. The temporary detour will greatly increase the amount of traffic along Butler Street so please be aware and plan your travel accordingly. The detour will run seven days a week.

The Pittsburgh Zoo has provided MACC with a list of days they feel will be most busy and residents may want to use alternatives to the intersections of Butler and Baker Streets. On the weekend of June 5th - 7th the Zoo will host the grand opening of the Shark Exhibit; June 21st is Fathers Day; July 4th Weekend and July 31st is their annual Summer Safari. Street Tree Program

The MACC & TreeVitalize Pittsburgh (a partnership to restore tree cover in the Pittsburgh region) invites you to join in the effort by REQUESTING a planting of a FREE Street Tree on your sidewalk. Street trees are trees planted between a street curb & sidewalk.

Request includes FREE evaluation of site, FREE curb cut (if needed), FREE Tree (if approved), FREE planting. Please know that the trees will be sized appropriately to the area; relieving the possibilities of too large roots that can damage sidewalks and utilities. Please know that these are smaller shade trees and not overwhelming forest trees.

If you haven't noticed, we have already planted over 50 sidewalk street trees in the community and we hope to reach 100 or more by 2010.

You are required to apply with the City of Pittsburgh each year so it is important that you complete and return your application and supporting documents in a timely manner so that they can apply the reduction to your City of Pittsburgh Real Estate Taxes.

Morningside Elementary Project Team Recommends Developer to School Board

MACC, working alongside the Urban Redevelopment Authority (URA), the offices of State Senator Jim Ferlo and the Pittsburgh Public Schools (PPS), recommended to the Pittsburgh School Board to select Green Development as the developer for the Morningside Elementary School. The project team, using input from MACC's business district planning process, reviewed several innovative proposals to renovate the empty school building.

Jessica Smith Perry of the URA attended the April MACC meeting and presented the benefits of the Green Development proposal to the community. Ms. Smith Perry explained that the Morningside Elementary project is at the forefront of converting the school district's portfolio of excess buildings. The proposed project seeks to create seventeen to twenty-two units of high quality market rate rental units in the heart of the neighborhood's business district.

The school board will be discussing the proposal at the end of May. Once approved, Green Development plans to engage the community to discuss the design and opportunities around the project.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Police Chief Nate Harper attended the May MACC meeting to address and update the community regarding safety matters.

The Chief made several recommendations including calling "911" for crimes in process, such as graffiti, drug dealing, loitering, etc. Please call "311" for property and maintenance issues, vandalism and other concerns.

The Chief explained the proposed Curfew Center. The Curfew Center will be located at 200 North Dithridge Street and will be run by Three River's Youth. If youth are being disruptive or loitering, they will get one warning to leave. If they do not leave, they will be taken to the Curfew Center. The Curfew Center is pending approval by Pittsburgh City Council.
